



Diamonds Around the Neck and Even on the Shoes

LOS ANGELLES, Feb. 29 — Perhaps it was fitting in a year when hobbits, seafarers and a racehorse dominated much of pre-Oscar conversation that the Academy Awards should feel less like a fashion-centric girls' night out. Most of the gowns faded in memory just after their wearers moved on from their red-carpet chat with Joan Rivers.

But who will forget Johnny Depp's bow tie, obscured by a shirt collar the size of a table napkin? Or the director Peter Jackson's floppy oversize suit and loose tie, looking as if stopped somewhere between the closets of John Belushi and a University of Vermont physics professor.

The 76th Academy Awards were marked by the return of the red carpet, foreshortened last year when the Oscar ceremony coincided with the start of the Iraq war. The ostentatious displays of excitement returned. It became acceptable once again for fashion commentators to get woozy over diamond-encrusted Lucite shoes (offered by Stuart Weitzman, worth about \$2 million and worn by Alison Krauss during her musical performance) and for hairdressers to make grand proclamations in advance about the viability of various red carpet styles.
